


Strong Winds Tuesday P.M.

Weather Message of the Day:




- Strong and possibly locally damaging winds likely this afternoon into this evening; gusty winds again later Wednesday
- Small risk of brief tornadoes & locally damaging winds with storms this afternoon & evening
- Torrential downpours with a limited flash flood risk Tuesday afternoon & evening

Important Forecast Changes



Storms and severe threat may linger later into the evening as compared to previous forecast.



Strong Wind Threat

STRONG WINDS WITH CRISTOBAL'S REMNANTS

Timeline of Strongest Winds

1 PM-10 PM CDT Tuesday


- Gusts up to 40-45 mph
 - Medium-high confidence
- Threat for gusts up to 50+ mph, including in heavier showers.
- Direction (from): Southeast shifting to south

Hazards

- Loose objects and tents may be blown around
- Tree damage and power outages possible
- Difficult to hazardous travel for high profile vehicles



Certainty & Considerations: Two periods of strong winds with the first one this afternoon and this evening being the more pronounced. Southwest gusts Wednesday afternoon expected to be around 30 mph.

Winds SE to SW 20 to 30 mph, gusts up to 45 mph



Noon through 10 pm






- Hazardous travel for high profile vehicles




Wind Advisory in effect from noon to 10 pm CDT for counties shaded in tan.



Severe Threat

Isolated Severe Weather Possible Tuesday P.M.



Tuesday, June 9, 2020 5:10 AM CDT

Hazards: Likelihood/Risk Level



Lightning: Occasional



Damaging Winds: 60+ mph



Tornado: Limited risk of brief tornadoes



WHEN

Tuesday afternoon / evening, from 4 P.M through midnight.


ACTION

Monitor the weather and have a plan of action if severe weather occurs.

Certainty & Considerations: Showers and storms will be moving near due north, even possibly northwest at times this afternoon. Some stronger to severe storms, if they develop, may not have any lightning at all. While some are likely to rotate and be gusty, it is still lower confidence that true severe thunderstorms will materialize this afternoon. There is a better chance of isolated severe storms with lightning this evening.



Heavy Rainfall Threat

Heavy Rain Potential This Afternoon/Evening

HIGHLIGHTS

Fast moving showers and isolated t-storms likely this afternoon and evening.

Heavier showers & storms will produce brief, but torrential, downpours (rainfall rates similar to May 17th)

Widespread flooding not expected, but pockets of road ponding and localized flooding possible.

WHERE


Mainly northwest of I-57 in northern Illinois, with highest threat for localized flooding in the yellow shaded areas on map.

WHEN


This afternoon and evening.

ACTION

Monitor the latest forecasts for updates.



Certainty & Considerations: High confidence in torrential rain producing showers and storms. Medium confidence duration will be brief enough to keep flash flood threat on lower end of spectrum. Yellow shaded areas are WPC's day 1 slight risk for flooding from excessive rainfall.



Moderate to High Swim Risk Tuesday

DANGEROUS SWIMMING Conditions Tuesday Stay out of the Water!

WHAT

High waves of 4 to 8 feet and life threatening currents.

WHERE

High Risk: Illinois beaches
Moderate Risk: Northwest Indiana beaches

WHEN

Tuesday afternoon through Tuesday night


ACTIONS

Stay out of the water. Obey posted signs & closures; use extreme caution walking near the lake.


